

**Heather Gerken** is the Dean and Sol & Lillian Goldman Professor of Law at Yale Law School. Dean Gerken is one of the country's leading experts on constitutional law and election law. A founder of the "nationalist school" of federalism, her work focuses on federalism, diversity, and dissent. Hailed as an "intellectual guru" in the *New York Times*, Professor Gerken's scholarship has been featured in *The Atlantic*, the *Boston Globe*, NPR, the *New York Times*, and *Time*.

At Yale, she founded and runs the country's most innovative clinic in local government law. Professor Gerken is also a renowned teacher who has won awards at both Yale and Harvard and was named one of the nation's "twenty-six best law teachers." Professor Gerken clerked for Judge Stephen Reinhardt of the 9th Circuit and Justice David Souter of the United States Supreme Court. She then served as an appellate lawyer in Washington, D.C., before joining the Harvard Law School faculty in 2000.

Gerken came to Yale in 2006 and became the inaugural J. Skelly Wright Professor of Law in 2008. She began her tenure as Yale's 17<sup>th</sup> dean, starting July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017.
